2023 Lifetime Achievement Award



Norma Jean Beasler

Norma Jean performed on radio stations in Oklahoma City and at age 12 had her own radio show on KLPR-AM. In 1955 she got a regular spot on ABC-TV show Ozark Jubilee in Springfield, Missouri, where she stayed for two years and first received national exposure. It was on this show that Host Red Foley suggested calling her simply "Norma Jean" and that name became official in 1958. They also coined the term "Pretty Miss Norma Jean" as she is still known today. She toured with Merl Lindsay and His Oklahoma Night Riders at age 16, followed by the Bill Gray Band at 18 where she was the band's full-time vocalist. Early on, she befriended soon-to-be country star Wanda Jackson, who is a member in the CHHS Hall of Fame.

She met Porter Wagoner on the show, and in 1959 she signed a recording contract with Columbia Records. Wagoner invited her to audition for his syndicated weekly TV program, which she did, and Norma Jean became a regular on his show in 1961 and stayed for six years, making her the first female in country music history to be a national TV regular. Dolly Parton has said she had a hard time replacing Norma Jean on the show because Norma Jean was so loved by the country fans.

She has toured and performed across the country with Wagoner, and RCA Victor producer Chet Atkins signed her to a recording contract with RCA Victor, ultimately recording 31 studio albums. Norma Jean is one of only 190 artists who are members of the Grand Ole Opry.

In Branson, Missouri, Norma Jean opened Norma Jean's Cowboy Church. She used her God-given gift and shared her testimony through song. After closing her church, she moved to South Texas, performing at major events with other stars. Norma Jean still finds time to share her faith with others.

Having several Top 10 hits, she produced a series of solid country singles and albums and continued to appear on Wagoner's show. On television she projected a wholesome image, singing hurting and cheating songs relevant to her personal life.

Norma's biggest hit came in 1966 with Bobby Bare and Liz Anderson, "The Game of Triangles", a wife-husband-other-woman drama that hit number five on the Billboard chart and earned the trio a Grammy nomination.

In recent years she has been associated with the Cowboy Church in Branson. In 2005 she released her first album of new music in 15 years. This album contains a song titled, "Pretty Miss Norma Jean", which was recorded by Wanda Jackson.

Another Capitol Hill graduate, Joe Settlemires, who is the performing artist for the 2023 Hall of Fame luncheon and member of the Hall of Fame, says "Norma Jean has made it her life's goal to care about people first, make her fans feel special whether it be performing on or off stage. She has taken her talent and shared it with others, inspiring them to a better life for themselves."

2023 Lifetime Achievement Award

Ben's family moved to the CHHS South Oklahoma City area where he would attend Capitol Hill Junior High and then Capitol Hill Senior High. Ben met Mr. Connors, the mechanical and architectural drawing teacher, who would change his life. His enthusiasm led to being selected two years in a row to represent Capitol Hill at the State Drafting Contest at OSU. In the summer of 1962 his family moved to Moore but Ben wanted to continue at Capitol Hill. He bought a 1958 Bel Aire to ferry him back and forth. After school he worked at the Moore Humpty Dumpty as a checker, a job he held until being hired by the OU School of Architecture. After three years under Mr. Connors, Ben decided to pursue a degree in architecture at the University of Oklahoma.

After graduation at OU Ben enlisted in the Navy to attend Officer's Candidate School and moved his family to Rhode Island where he worked part time for a small architectural firm and was responsible for the design of a city park located on Newport harbor. When released from the Navy in 1971, he brought his family back to Oklahoma City and began working as an apprentice for Fred Quinn, then became registered in 1974 and passed his licensing exam on his first attempt.

Ben formed Ben Graves & Associates in March of 1974 on Campus Corner with a focus on the design of private residences and projects for public education. His firm changed names to Architects in Partnership. While managing his growing firm he also taught construction documents as an adjunct professor at OU, which he enjoyed, with fond memories of the talented students who would later join his firm as apprentices, some of whom would form their own successful firms. In the '70's and early '80's, he became interested in building and developing real estate; he designed and built multiple single family and multifamily developments in Norman and Oklahoma City. He headed up design on the renovation of the Black Hotel in Oklahoma City, Brookhaven Village in west Norman, and many commercial projects. His office interior design of the Summit Building office

would receive an AIA Merit award in 1983. After forming AIP, which was servicing schools and universities, with partner John Buckley's expertise, their company became recognized as one of the state's leading firms. In 1992 Governor David Walters appointed Ben to his first of three terms to the State Board of Licensed Architects and Landscape Architects. From 1992 to 2009 Ben was a member of NCARB on the ARE grading and test preparation committee, becoming chairman of the Methods and Materials Division. He was placed on the Board of Advisors of the Oklahoma State Fire Marshal's office, Faculty Selection Committee, and National Accreditation Committee for the OU School of Architecture. He continues to serve on the Board of Visitors for the College of Architecture.

His career in real estate development is staggering.


In the late '90's, there was a desperate need for improved detention facilities as the State Health Department and Fire Marshal's Office began enforcing stricter health standards and life safety requirements of county jails. So Ben educated himself on jail design, correctional standards and county government, worked with county and state sheriffs officials to identify existing problems and solutions. His firm became a leader in detention facility design, and has designed and built 19 county jails in Oklahoma over the last fifteen years, more than all other firms in the state.

After being appointed to the Oklahoma State Fire Marshals Commission, and knowing that most county jails were deficient in all aspects, AIP became Oklahoma's jail experts, growing staff from 12-15 to 24-25 and completing 17 jails.

The underlying theme of Ben Graves' career has always been to use effective solutions to fit a budget, meet the client's program, bring joy to the users and present a timeless environment to serve the population for generations.

In 2010 Ben retired to the lake and golf course, and his firm was bought by his employees.

2023 JW Mashburn Community Leadership Award



Gary Peck 1967

Gary was the oldest of three children, growing up in a poor family, with a mother and grandparents and aunt who worked hard for the family, sometimes with nothing to eat. These adults greatly influenced Gary, with their dedication to having a better life, and were truly role models during his formative years.

He attended Heronville grade school, Jackson Junior High, and Capitol Hill High School. During high school he worked at McDonald's to earn money to support his mom and sisters. After graduation he married his sweetheart Joyce, also a CHHS graduate, and attended Central State College as a walkon, and received a full ride scholarship his sophomore year; however, he had to leave CSC to work and support his wife

and new son in 1968. So it was back to McDonald's full time as a store manager, learning the business and how to make it profitable. In 1970 he worked for Lemuel Legends in Norman, and began a pattern, emphasizing the importance of people development for business success.

In 1971 he returned to McDonald's as a Supervisor and Training Manager, developed a Manager Training Program, which would be utilized in the franchise stores where he was working AND in the corporate McDonald's restaurants. In 1973 he and his family moved to Houston and he was on a partner track, opening 10 McDonald's restaurants. In 1978 he began a lifetime career with the corporation, was promoted to Area/Senior Supervisor, Training Manager, Hamburger University Professor, and Operations Manager, all while flipping burgers. In 1994, at 44 years old, he purchased seven McDonald's restaurants and became an owner/operator, but flipping the burgers for himself. He had cashed in his stock options, profit sharing, and savings at a huge financial risk, but realized that life is what you make of it.

During these years he had several award-winning stores for sales/profit, quality, service and cleanliness; and also many employees who earned awards for their positive impact on the business. He served as Regional Leadership Chair, Store Economics Team Chair, and National Profit Team Chair, making a true impact for his business and other owner operators.

While the Regional Leadership Chair, he represented 200 owners/operators in the region. He developed the first online national manual for building profitable stores, outlining the steps to running a successful McDonald's restaurant. This manual outlined a response to economic changes and how to forecast costs, profits and losses. Gary says he's "proud that the manual leveraged many of his past experiences in the business to produce future changes and provide the foundation for growth through the McDonald's business model."

2023 Humanitarian Award

Dr. McCharen has been a logical, determined, vocal advocate for public education -- as a teacher, coach, high school principal, athletic director, assistant superintendent, assistant Superintendent of Eastern Oklahoma Tech Center, and Superintendent of Choctaw-Nicoma Park Schools. Everyone who knows him, especially his district teachers, staff, and patrons, knows he is passionate and relentless regarding his lobbying efforts for public education. "Every legislator in the Choctaw area and throughout the state knows Jim."

In 2009, with school board and community confidence at an all-time high, Jim presented a proposal for a \$94 million dollar revenue-lease bond issue, personally giving 17 bond presentations during the two months before the election.

It was passed with an 86% yes vote. This bond issue transformed the district and now Choctaw-Nicoma Park has some of the finest 6A schools and facilities in the state. As Superintendent, his district had passed \$135 million in bond issues with an 85% average approval rating.

Choctaw High School's Alternative School for at-risk students has won the Oklahoma Foundation of Excellence's Award as one of the best Alternative schools in the State and was recognized in 2010 as one of the top three "Students At Risk" schools in the Nation.

Under Dr. McCharen's leadership the classrooms have excelled with every Elementary school being a "Great Expectations" school; the High School has received so many awards that it would fill a page; the high school students rank at or above the National average. During his tenure, the athletic teams, academic teams, and fine arts programs have won 31 State Championships and ten State-Runner-Ups. All that, plus the CHS teams have won 27 Athletic Academic State Championships.

2023 President's Award

When Stormi was in the 9th grade her family moved from the Moore district to the Okahoma City Capitol Hill High School district where she attended through high school, graduating in 2014. While at CHHS, she participated in clubs and organizations ranging from Health Occupational Students of America, Spanish Club, soccer, track, volleyball, cheerleading, and dance. After taking her first dance lesson at age 16 under Adelita Dixon-Hernandez, she knew that dance was going to be what she invested in for the rest of her life-long studies.

Upon her high school graduation, she attended the University of Central Oklahoma, graduating with her B.A. in Dance Education in 2019. While at UCO she received the

Outstanding pk-12 Undergraduate Education Major Award and also the Dean's Recognition Award in Dance. As a former member of UCO's touring dance company, Kaleidoscope, she has worked with artists DIAVOLO, Jeremy Duvall, Mike Esperanza, Noa Shiloh, and many more. She has participated in professional conferences for the National Dance Education Organization and National Undergraduate Research as a co-presenter/performer. She was chosen to be a writer by the Oklahoma State Department of Education to create the framework for the new Oklahoma State Dance Standards. A certified dance educator, Stormi is the head chair for the CHHS Fine Arts Department and the Sites Coordinator for the Academy of Arts.

Aside from her teaching career, Stormi is also a member of the Perpetual Motion Dance Company, which is a nonprofit professional Modern and Aerial Dance company based in Oklahoma City that began in 2002. Her company titles are dancer, aerialist, educator, public schools liaison, and coordinator of Oklahoma Contemporary Dance Festival.
