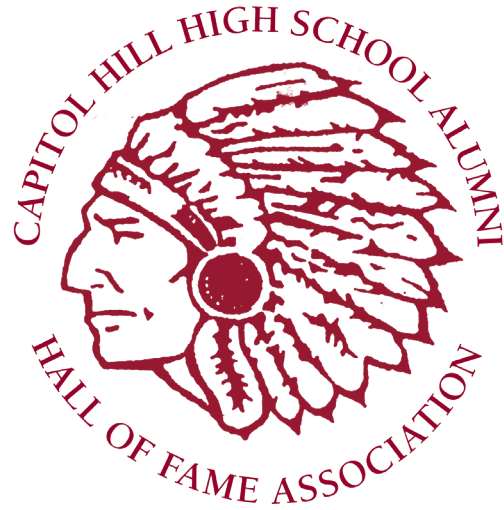

2025 Lifetime Achievement Award

Charles T. Harris

Class of 1955



A proud member of the Capitol Hill High School Class of 1955, Charles Harris grew up in post-WWII South Oklahoma City, where hard work was expected right after graduation. After completing a printing course under his favorite teacher, E.J. Stockton, Charles was prepared for a skilled trade—but an unexpected opportunity at the Oklahoma Tax Commission launched his 17-year career in public service.

In the early 1970s, Charles followed his entrepreneurial instincts into real estate. Leveraging his leadership experience as CHHS Trade and Industry Club President, he joined ABIDE Realtors and quickly advanced. Within three years, he and his wife, Barbara, opened a second office in Bethany, with Charles serving

as General Manager and Executive VP.

Their passion for helping others achieve homeownership—what Charles calls “a hedge against inflation”—fueled explosive growth. In under a decade, ABIDE expanded to 19 offices and 280 sales associates across Oklahoma City and Tulsa. Barbara became a top residential agent, consistently closing over \$7.5 million annually for 14 years.

Recognizing the need for agent education and professional development, Charles founded the ABIDE Academy of Real Estate. The academy trained agents in customer service, finance, and personal growth, encouraging innovation and positivity in the industry. In 1984, Charles purchased ABIDE, Inc., making it the largest independently owned real estate company in Oklahoma. His influence continued to grow: He was appointed to the Oklahoma State Real Estate Commission in 1985 and served on the Education Commission committee, shaping future generations of realtors. He was elected to the National Association of Realtors Board in 1986 and earned the Omega Tau Rho Medallion for service in 1989. He also served on the Oklahoma State Real Estate Commission’s Committee on Education, shaping future generations of realtors.

Today, Charles enjoys retirement with family and friends, especially over games of Gin Rummy with his sons Curt and Brad, and his friend Max. A leader, educator, and visionary, Charles Harris is a worthy recipient of the Capitol Hill High School Alumni Hall of Fame Association’s 2025 Lifetime Achievement Award.

2025 J.W. Mashburn Community Leadership Award

Colonel (R) Robert E. Henson

Class of 1965



Nominated by his brother-in-law, Bill Grissom, Robert Henson is a lifelong leader, athlete, coach, educator, and decorated military officer whose impact spans generations. From his early days at Columbus Elementary, Robert was passionate about sports. At Jackson Junior High, he competed in football and track and played with the CHHS C squad. As a senior at Capitol Hill High School, he placed third in the state in both the high and low hurdles—an early glimpse of his lifelong dedication to athletics.

Robert earned a B.S. in Education from Central State in 1969 while working full-time for the OKC Parks and Recreation Department. That same year, he joined the Army Reserve and directed the 1969 NAIA National Cross Country Championships. After active duty and

a collapsed lung in 1970 cut short his own athletic pursuits, he turned to teaching and earned a Master's in Education in 1972.

His passion for coaching led him to develop year-round Track & Field programs for students from elementary through college, helping thousands stay focused and active regardless of season or setting.

In 1978, Robert returned to military service, rising through the ranks with roles including Operations Officer, Comptroller, and was instrumental in establishing the 402d Army Reserve Field Artillery Training Brigade, mobilized for Desert Storm. He later served at the 5th U.S. Army Headquarters and 89th Army Reserve Command, working on strategic training programs and mobilization efforts across the southwest U.S., and supporting deployment readiness during Desert Storm.

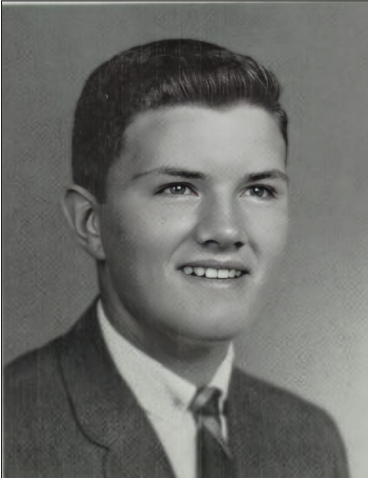
His final military assignments included leading international military sports competitions at Fort Sam Houston, TX, and serving as Deputy Chief of Staff at the Army Personnel Records Center in St. Louis. He retired as a full Colonel after 27 years, 11 months, and 22 days of service.

Post-retirement, Robert returned to education as a JROTC instructor in South Texas—continuing to guide and shape young lives. His lifelong commitment to leadership, service, and mentorship makes him a worthy inductee into the Capitol Hill High School Alumni Hall of Fame Association's 2025 JW Mashburn Community Leadership Award.

2025 Humanitarian Award

Dr. Jim R. Muse

Class of 1966



Dr. Jim Muse, a proud product of Rockwood Elementary and Jackson Junior High, served as Drum Major both there and later for the “Pride of Capitol Hill” Band during his senior year at CHHS. A lifelong Southsider, Jim and his wife, Janet Keith Muse (both Class of 1966), have remained deeply connected to the CHHS community. He chaired the Class of 1966 Reunion Committee in 1985, hosting events that strengthened bonds built decades earlier. Admired for his warmth and generosity, Jim is known among classmates as a true embodiment of the Redskin Spirit.

After CHHS, Jim attended the University of Oklahoma before transferring to Logan College of Chiropractic in St. Louis, where he earned his degree magna cum laude in 1971. He began his career at the Chiropractic Arts Center in Oklahoma City, later becoming sole practitioner and ultimately opening the Chiropractic Arts Center of Moore in 2002. His guiding principle has always been compassionate, ethical care—values that helped inspire all three of his children to pursue careers in chiropractic care as well.

Dr. Muse’s professional legacy includes over five decades of service to the chiropractic field and the greater Oklahoma City community. He has held leadership positions with the Chiropractic Association of Oklahoma, the Oklahoma Chiropractic Education Commission, and served on the Oklahoma Health Care Study Commission. Since 1997, he has been a court-appointed Independent Medical Examiner for the Oklahoma Workers’ Compensation System and a consultant for the Oklahoma Education and Employees Insurance Group.

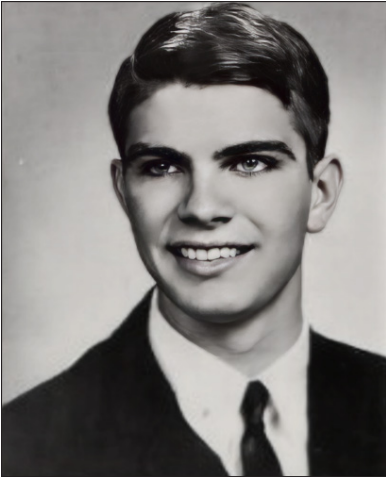
In addition to professional service, Jim has been active in Rotary, holding a ten-year perfect attendance pin, and participated in the South OKC Chamber of Commerce for 20 years. His contributions have helped shape policy, elevate standards in chiropractic care, and reinforce public trust in the profession.

2025 President's Award

Anthony D. "Tony" DeGiusti

Class of 1967



A proud 1967 graduate of Capitol Hill High School, Anthony "Tony" DeGiusti has left an enduring mark as an educator, legal advocate, and community leader. Known affectionately as "Mr. D.," he devoted over 30 years to teaching social studies in Oklahoma City Public Schools. More than a teacher, he was a mentor who inspired students not only through his lessons but through genuine care and belief in their potential—so much so that many still count him among their all-time favorites.

Tony's commitment to education extended beyond the classroom. While teaching full-time, he earned a Master's in Journalism from the University of Oklahoma and later a Juris Doctor from Oklahoma City University, attending law school at night. From 1992 to 2022, he practiced law, offering free or reduced-cost legal aid—especially to fellow educators—often long after retirement.

His passion for justice led him to become a key figure in the American Federation of Teachers (AFT). As the first Field Representative of OKC-AFT and later its President, Tony played a pivotal role in preserving the union's bargaining status in 1988, earning the nickname "Mr. AFT." He was also a picket captain during Oklahoma's historic 1979 teacher strike and served a decade as Chief Legal Counsel for OKC-AFT, securing major wins for educators and public schools. In 2023, he was inducted into the Oklahoma AFL-CIO Labor Hall of Fame.

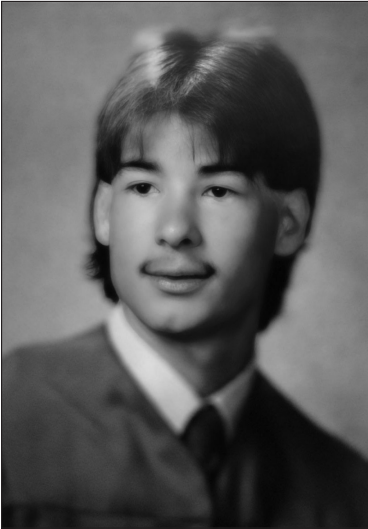
Tony's life is a testament to "service before self." He's known for quietly supporting teachers and friends facing health challenges — handling errands, legal matters, and offering comfort. A published author and fluent Italian speaker, he remains closely tied to Capitol Hill High, chairing alumni events and preserving school history—even relocating monkey bars from his childhood elementary school to his backyard.

Tony DeGiusti is more than an alumnus—he is a champion for education, justice, and community. His tireless efforts, integrity, and compassion make him a deserving inductee into the Capitol Hill High School Alumni Hall of Fame Association with the 2025 President's Award.

2025 Athletic Award

Charles B. “Chuck” Jackson

Class of 1987



Charles “Chuck” Jackson has been a lifelong ambassador for Capitol Hill High School. Whether during his 30+ years with UPS or in his volunteer efforts, Chuck proudly promotes his alma mater wherever he goes. Raised near CHHS, he vividly remembers hearing the marching band practice, watching homecoming parades, and dreaming of his own Redskin moment.

That dream became reality when he stepped onto the CHHS field, excelling as a multi-sport athlete. Chuck lettered in five sports, was team MVP in both football and swimming, and earned All-City honors in baseball and swimming. As quarterback, he led the team as a 1st Team 4A-6 District selection. His talent was matched by his character, and he was a respected leader in athletics, the classroom, and Student Council.

Chuck’s dedication to CHHS didn’t stop after graduation. He earned a scholarship to Oklahoma City University and immediately began giving back—coaching football and swimming at Capitol Hill from 1987 to 1997. In 2015, he revived the CHHS Booster Club, connecting generations of alumni through events like the annual Alumni Cookout and the “Sponsor a Player” campaign. He’s also organizing celebrations for the 1973 State Championship Basketball Team and the 50th anniversary of the first integrated football game at Moses F. Miller Stadium.

Chuck works closely with CHHS leadership to enhance school spirit, including efforts to establish a dedicated Alumni Room in the new high school building. As advisor to the CHHS Alumni Association, his leadership continues to bridge past and present.

A UPS veteran since 1992, Chuck has been recognized for outstanding service, including 20+ years of safe driving and top delivery performance. A lifelong member of Asbury United Methodist Church, he has served in roles ranging from youth director to worship leader.

Chuck Jackson’s tireless commitment to CHHS, his community, and his church reflect the very best of Redskin spirit. He’s a dynamic leader, a generous spirit, and a worthy recipient of the Capitol Hill High School Alumni Hall of Fame Association’s 2025 Athletic Award.

Our Town

As I have observed the goings on here at our 25-year reunion, seen your faces, renewed friendships, and learned about your lives in 1992, I have been struck by the reality of how much things change.

It does seem like yesterday that we were kids, roaming the halls of Capitol Hill High School, our lives basically just beginning. But think of the change that has occurred since then. Think of the change in just the last five years. There is no Berlin Wall, no iron curtain, no Soviet Union, no Johnny Carson. God, what a horrible thought. But those are all realities from our past that are gone.

And I suspect that that's why we all come together every five years--some from very far away--to try and capture something very special that doesn't really exist any longer. Yes, the Capitol Hill of our youth no longer exists. Think about it. We were a town within a city--Capitol Hill. We had our own landmarks, our own movie theaters, our own shopping district, our own invisible borders. We were, for the most part, blue collar, not wealthy by any means. Most of us lived in small homes, with good, decent, solid parents who had weathered the Depression and who tried very hard to make a better life for us.

We were homogeneous--a fact that probably was not all good, because homogeneity fosters misconceptions and stereotypes; but for the most part we were all fair-minded and just. And while a similar hue and texture has its down side, it also has its advantages, for it gave us a sense of togetherness, of community, of camaraderie that might have been missing otherwise.

I have tried to explain to my friends from different areas what it was like growing up in Capitol Hill, and I'm sure I haven't been real successful at it. But I tell them this: People from other parts of the city either disliked us, feared us, pitied us, or admired us. But regardless, there was always a feeling of us and them. That's why we were so close, why we identified with one another. Sure we fought and bickered among ourselves, but we were pretty much family. And no matter where you go, if you run into anyone from the 60's on back who is a Capitol Hill grad, there's an instant bond, maybe a trust, something that goes unsaid, but you both know that there's something special between you.

That us-and-them feeling I mentioned is gone now, too, just like the Berlin Wall. And it's probably a good thing. For although it gave us a special character--and a good laugh when northsiders were afraid to come to our football games--it has changed, like just about everything does.

Our town within a city is gone, its borders blurred, its identity no longer well-defined.

And that, my friends, is why we, after 25 years, still come together--not just to renew friendships as others do in class reunions all over the country, but to celebrate the existence a few years ago of our town. We were there. We lived it. And we miss it.

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
