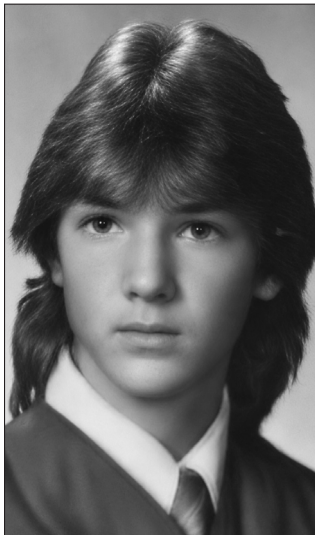

Every legend starts with a spark. For Mark Rendeluk, growing up on the Southside of Oklahoma City, that spark was born on two wheels at just three years old. A sophomore letterman in baseball at Capitol Hill High School, Mark's relentless work ethic and passion quickly led him to trade the diamond for the shop floor, enrolling at Foster Estes to master the art of automotive paint and body.

That elite craftsmanship blossomed into Mr. Paint—a premier local business that earned top honors at the legendary Darryl Starbird Car Shows and laid the foundation for an unstoppable drag racing career. Side-by-side with his long-time crew chief, Chris Wedman, Mark didn't just compete on the quarter-mile; he dominated it. Racking up an astonishing 15 World Championships in PMRA Super Comp and Pro Mod, he established himself as one of the most feared and respected racers on the planet. His global impact even earned him a personal invitation from the Crown Prince of Kuwait to help build their national motorcycle drag racing program.

True grit, however, is tested in the face of adversity. After undergoing quad bypass surgery, Mark was forced into temporary retirement. Yet, true champions don't stay down. Recruited back by the world-renowned East Coast DME Racing Team, Mark made a historic return, shattering records to become one of only five motorcycle drag racers in history to cross the mythical 240 MPH barrier.

From local craftsman to global racing icon, Mark's legacy is built on relentless drive, heart, and pure speed. CHHS is proud to honor a true pioneer, business owner, and world champion.

2026 J.W. Mashburn Community Leadership Award

Connie Crew

Class of 1959



Connie Crew has spent a lifetime running the race with endurance, lifting others up at every turn. A proud 1959 graduate of Capitol Hill High School, Connie was a force of nature in motion, lettered in four sports, and earned the coveted Outstanding Athlete Trophy from the Girls' "O" Club in an era long before Title IX.

Driven by a passion for education and movement, she earned degrees from Howard Payne College and Baylor University. In 1964, she returned to her alma mater, volunteering to coach countless young women at CHHS without pay. In 1972, she was hired by South Oklahoma

City Junior College to build a groundbreaking "Lifetime Sports" curriculum from scratch, creatively utilizing church basements and open fields before campus facilities even existed.

After 20 years of transforming lives through physical education, Connie answered a profound call to ministry and community advocacy. Her faith took her from serving as the Director of the Baptist Women's Center shelter in Oklahoma City to teaching English across the globe in South Korea and China.

Returning home in 1993, Connie served as the Northwest Area Director for the Community Action Agency, fighting tirelessly for underserved neighborhoods. In retirement, she poured her heart into her church, teaching Conversational English and guiding immigrants through citizenship preparation.

Coach, professor, missionary, and advocate, Connie Crew is a true titan of leadership, heart, and community. CHHS is proud to honor her tonight.

2026 President's Award

Jan Speegle Scott

Class of 1967



Jan Speegle Scott's story is deeply interwoven with the fabric of Oklahoma City, built on a lifetime of energetic leadership, public service, and enduring Red and White spirit. Her journey began in the heart of South OKC, attending Lafayette Elementary and Capitol Hill Junior High—where she served as Student Council President—before graduating from Capitol Hill High School in 1967. As a vibrant All-School Cheerleader, Pep Club Sweetheart, and member of the French Club and Pep Council, Jan constantly brought the crowds to their feet.

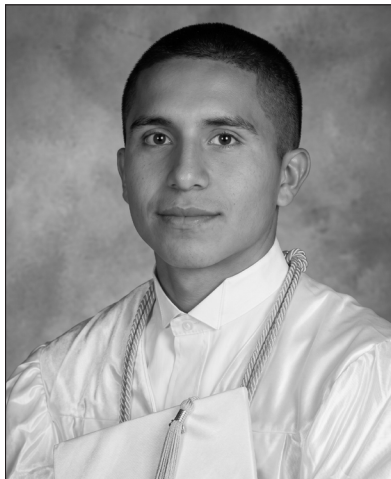
She carried that passion to Central State University, serving as Head Cheerleader and earning an Education degree in 1972. Jan's early athletic foundation in Track and Field, Swimming, and the Junior Olympics fueled a remarkable 50-year career in public recreation and education. Notably, she championed community health, youth sports, and senior activities as the Director of Yukon Parks and Recreation for over 20 years, and later as Executive Director of the Oklahoma Recreation and Park Society.

Jan's heart for service extends from driving Mobile Meals to co-coordinating the Veterans Tribute at Chapel Hill Methodist Church. Through it all, her loyalty to Capitol Hill never wavered, as she continuously served on the Class of '67 Reunion Committee and the Reunions of the Sixties. A devoted wife to Bill, mother of three sons, and grandmother of eight, Jan embodies extraordinary community dedication. We are proud to honor her lifetime of service with the 2026 President's Award.

2026 Athletic Award

Jaime Perez

Class of 2007



Every legend starts with a single step, and for Capitol Hill High School, Jaime Perez was a force of nature from the moment he laced up his cleats. Stepping onto the soccer pitch and cross-country trail as a freshman during the 2003–2004 season, Jaime immediately proved he belonged on the varsity stage by earning his first All-District Soccer Championship.

By his sophomore year, Jaime’s relentless work ethic secured him 1st Team All-District honors. As a junior, he was named Soccer Team Captain, leading the Redskins to another All-District Championship, the Redskin Cup, and a historic run to the Class 5A State Championship Runner-Up title. His phenomenal play earned him 1st Team All-District, 1st Team All-City, and The Daily Oklahoman High School Player of the Week honors.

Jaime’s senior year was a masterpiece of leadership and excellence, both on the field and in the classroom through the Student Council and National Honor Society. He capped his high school career with repeated 1st Team All-District and All-City honors, another All-District Championship, a prestigious selection to the 2007 Class 5A All-State Team, and the title of CHHS Athlete of the Year.

His passion carried him to Rogers State University on a soccer scholarship, where he was a four-year starter and the 2009–2010 Team MVP. Jaime later translated that same determination into a career in healthcare. A champion, leader, and inspiration, we celebrate a legacy of grit and unwavering leadership. Welcome to the Hall of Fame, Jaime Perez.

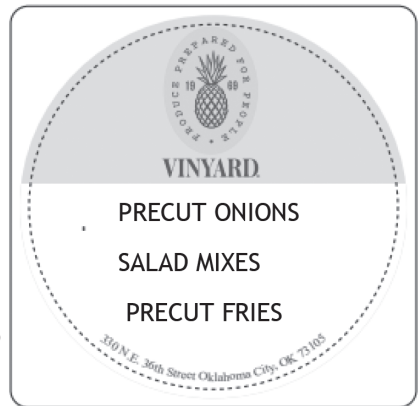
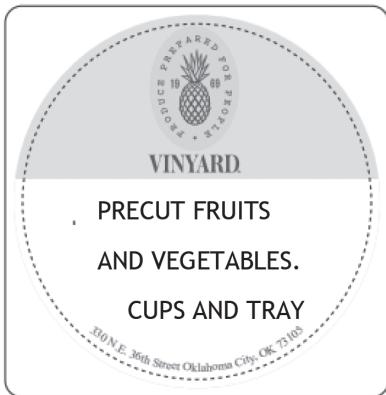

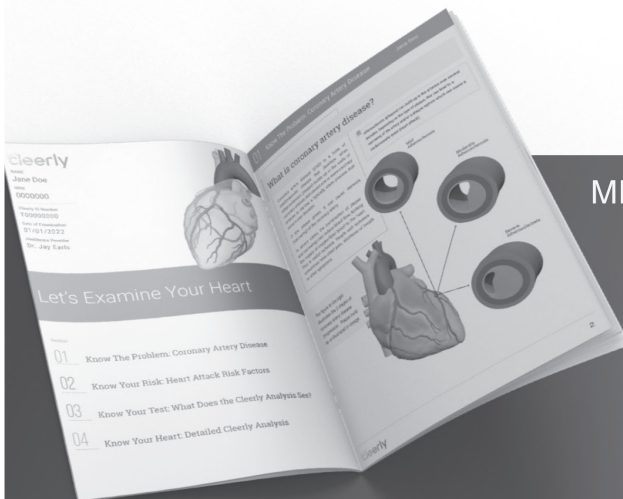

Our Town

As I have observed the goings on here at our 25-year reunion, seen your faces, renewed friendships, and learned about your lives in 1992, I have been struck by the reality of how much things change.

It does seem like yesterday that we were kids, roaming the halls of Capitol Hill High School, our lives basically just beginning. But think of the change that has occurred since then. Think of the change in just the last five years. There is no Berlin Wall, no iron curtain, no Soviet Union, no Johnny Carson. God, what a horrible thought. But those are all realities from our past that are gone.

And I suspect that that's why we all come together every five years--some from very far away--to try and capture something very special that doesn't really exist any longer. Yes, the Capitol Hill of our youth no longer exists. Think about it. We were a town within a city--Capitol Hill. We had our own landmarks, our own movie theaters, our own shopping district, our own invisible borders. We were, for the most part, blue collar, not wealthy by any means. Most of us lived in small homes, with good, decent, solid parents who had weathered the Depression and who tried very hard to make a better life for us.

We were homogeneous--a fact that probably was not all good, because homogeneity fosters misconceptions and stereotypes; but for the most part we were all fair-minded and just. And while a similar hue and texture has its down side, it also has its advantages, for it gave us a sense of togetherness, of community, of camaraderie that might have been missing otherwise.

I have tried to explain to my friends from different areas what it was like growing up in Capitol Hill, and I'm sure I haven't been real successful at it. But I tell them this: People from other parts of the city either disliked us, feared us, pitied us, or admired us. But regardless, there was always a feeling of us and them. That's why we were so close, why we identified with one another. Sure we fought and bickered among ourselves, but we were pretty much family. And no matter where you go, if you run into anyone from the 60's on back who is a Capitol Hill grad, there's an instant bond, maybe a trust, something that goes unsaid, but you both know that there's something special between you.

That us-and-them feeling I mentioned is gone now, too, just like the Berlin Wall. And it's probably a good thing. For although it gave us a special character--and a good laugh when northsiders were afraid to come to our football games--it has changed, like just about everything does.

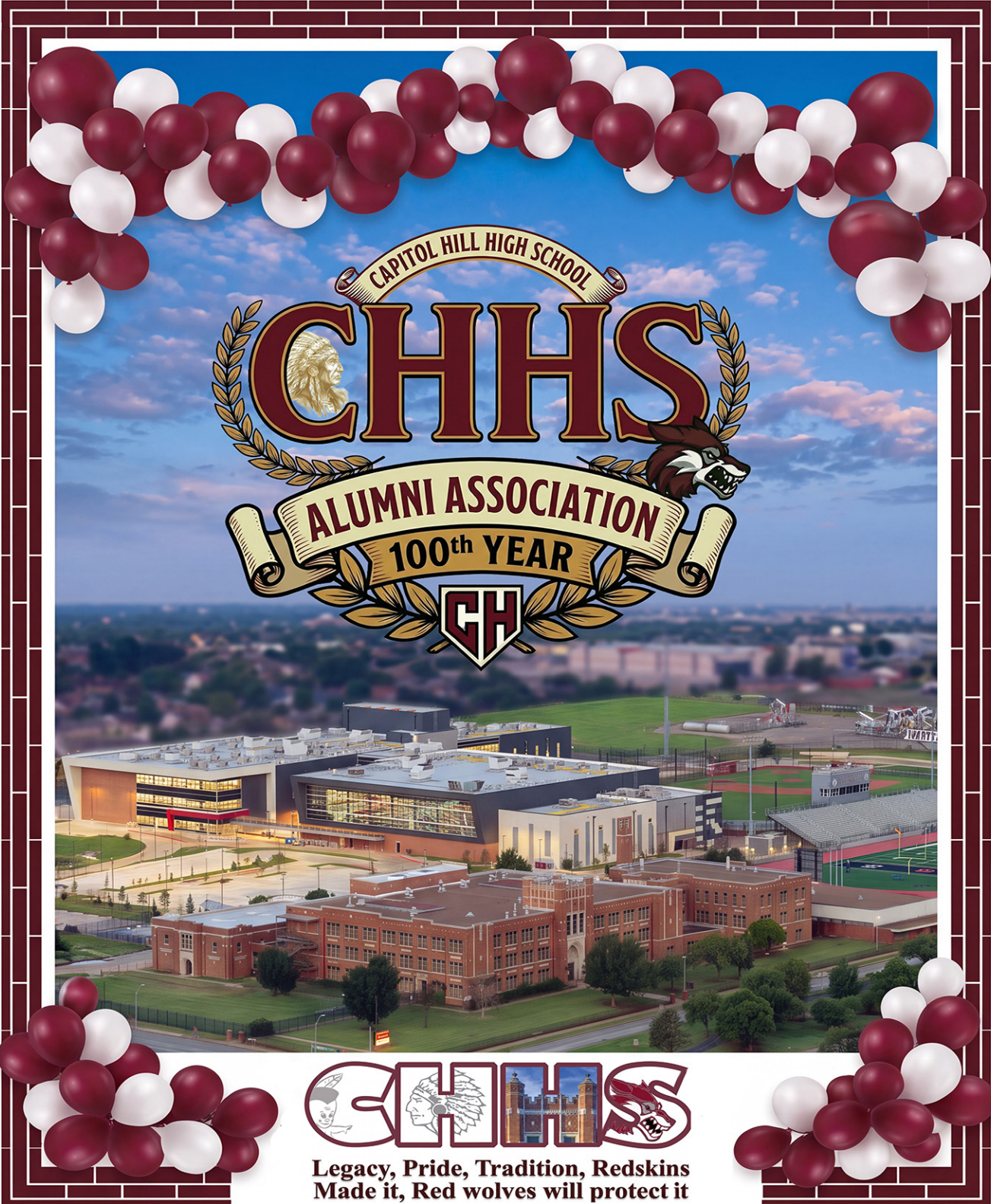
Our town within a city is gone, its borders blurred, its identity no longer well-defined.
